# HISTORY/GEOGRAPHY

Our Spring History Topic is the Great Fire of London. The children will be learning about the causes of the fire, what actually happened during this famous historical event, and what has happened since. I recommend a visit to The Monument in London where the children will also be able to see 'Pudding Lane'.

In Geography, the children will investigate the differing weather conditions in their immediate environment, name and recognise our four seasons, be introduced to hot and cold areas of the world and consider the impact of different weather types. They will also have opportunities to present their own weather forecasts!



#### MUSIC

We will be developing our knowledge and skills linked to rhythm, pitch and tempo during our music lessons.



Our Science Topic for the Spring Term is Seasonal Change, where the children will learn about the four seasons in greater detail, along with our specific winter focus. If you have a photograph of your child taken during our snowy days in December, please feel free to email me one in to put up on our winter display.

We will also focus on life cycles, and our five senses, completing learning activities where they can be explored in greater depth.

Our Stem activities include making our own simple weather equipment to make observations and measurements, and an edible life cycle of a butterfly!

**COMPUTING**: Children will be introduced to early

programming concepts, and explore giving individual commands using a floor robot. They will then work with presenting simple data after sorting objects into groups, and then ask and answer questions based on the information they gathered.

**PSHE:** We will be considering 'Diversity and Communities'.

# READING





Our reading books this term will include Tree; Seasons Come, Seasons Go, Bringing the Rain to Kapiti Plain and Fire Cat. These books will be used for our guided reading and used to inspire our writing. We welcome books and stories linked to our topics that can be shared with the class.

Children will bring home a book to share together from our school library, which can be changed on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Reading books will be changed Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. I can't stress enough how important it is for your child to read regularly at home with you.
