## Weekly project - Dinosaurs!

### Salt Dough Fossils

Ingredients 2 cups wheat flour 1 cup salt 1/2 cup warm water Plastic dinosaurs Mix the flour, salt, and warm water together to make the salt dough. Roll it into balls. Press the dinosaurs into the dough. Bake at 150C degrees for 2 -3 hours or until hard. Try salt dough bones too!

### Outdoor Fun

Collect lots of different shaped sticks and create a huge dinosaur model on the floor outside.

### Cookie Excavation!

Use a tooth pick and a paint brush to carefully excavate the chocolate chips from the cookie. How many did you find?
