The focus will be 'Materials' The children will be learning to name and discuss the properties of different materials. We will also explore the suitability of certain materials for certain objects.

We will also start to consider Seasonal Change, in particular, Autumn.

We will also be carrying out some challenging STEM activities – by investigating the best material to make a teddy a raincoat or umbrella, and also exploring the best materials to use to create shadows for Peter Pan.


COMPUTING: We will beginning the year looking at
