cover the following units

Using the 'maths mastery approach, our lessons will be multi-sensory using practical materials to support our learning.



Grammar and Punctuation.

The following areas will be covered this term:

Spelling will be taught daily, and homework will be set weekly via speeling frame.



Writing


Music
