

#### Back in October, Our Survey said!




#### The actions we have taken to improve this since October

- **4.** The relaunch of the daily mile programme.


### Class in the spotlight

This week we are focussed on Year 2

Year 2 have had a busy week but it all started before the Easter holidays! In English we looked at the features of persuasive writing and the children had to write letters to Mr Davey persuading him to let Year 2 have eggs in their classroom that they could watch grow hatch and grow into chicks.







In Science, we have been looking at the life cycles of different animals, including the life cycles of chicks. This was a perfect lead up to what was coming when the eggs arrived as we knew what was happening when they hatched.



On Monday, ten little eggs arrived into the classroom in their incubator! We learnt all about the temperature they had to be kept at and why and when they would hopefully hatch.







Wednesday, the fun began! As the children got to school they saw the first chick peck its way out of the shell and hatch. The chicks look exhausted when they break out of their shells and have to spend 24 hours in the incubator to dry out and fluff their feathers up. By the end of Wednesday we had seen 6 chicks hatch!





The chicks were moved out of their incubator on Thursday and spend the day getting used to the bigger space, learning how to eat their food off of the floor and huddling up warm under the lamp. We also had lots of visits from other classes who were all very excited to meet the chicks.









We have had a great time this week watching the eggs hatch and getting to know the chicks and can't wait to see how much bigger they get next week! Stay tuned for more updates and pictures from Year 2:)
